Tuscan Hill is a gated estate dramatically situated atop twelve quiet, private, rolling acres. Though just completed in 2006, the distinctive architectural design and décor of the home on Tuscan Hill exudes a timeless Italian/Mediterranean-style ambience. As the gate opens, the home on Tuscan Hill becomes more visible at the top of the long, curved lane with a deep forest to the right and more manicured lawn to the left. The private space on the back side of the home has patio space of just over 4000 sq ft on 2 levels and is equipped with a spa, fireplace and outdoor kitchen on one level and a saltwater pool and much more patio space on the lower level. The main floor of the 6500 sq ft home is comprised of five unique, free-flowing, interconnected spaces perfect for special gatherings. The second floor is one of Tuscan Hill's greatest treasures! With the "Tuscan Hill Bridal Lounge" on one end and "The Spa at Tuscan Hill" opening January 2011 on the other, the heart of the floor is the large bath/spa space with amenities that include a chromo-therapy spa, steam shower, bidet, washer, dryer, fireplace, wet bar, and front and back balconies overlooking Tuscan Hill.

The beautiful home of Doug and Erin Lurvey was built in 2008. They are the first owners of their French Country-inspired home, built by David Scheiderer. During the holidays, a number of handmade Santa Claus figurines are featured throughout the Lurvey home. These Santa's were created by Erin's parents, Randy & Sandy Russell. In 1983, the Russell's began their business called Folklore. They specialized in creating handmade molded papier-mâché Santa figures that resemble those produced in Germany at the turn of the century. The old-fashioned Santa's were made from a batter-like papier-mache mixture, were shaped into antique ice cream and chocolate molds and then hand painted. In the 1990s, the Russell's began making the larger three-foot and four-and-a-half foot Santa's which were created using papier-mâché, fabric, wood and antique objects. The basement of the Lurvey home features a golf room that includes a simulated golf driving range. In this room, actual golf balls are hit into a screen displaying a video of the swinger's golf course selection. The kitchen features an extensive Droll Design dish collection. Mrs. Lurvey and Ron Johnson of The Thicket will provide holiday décor for this wonderful home.

Playroom décor will be provided by Jellybeans. Gamble's Gift Gallery will provide holiday décor in the china cabinet and Town & Country Gifts and Collectibles will provide fresh floral for the dining room. Bedroom décor will be created by Dillard's Department Store, Nancy Rose and Ashley Furniture. Countryside Cottage will provide holiday décor in the Living Room. Kim Hardin will decorate the front porch and entryway. The family room will display home furnishings by Obelisk Home.

Tucked away in a wooded area in East Springfield is the breathtaking Old World Mediterranean-style home of the Barbo Family. This expansive home was designed and decorated by the Barbo Family. The unique rooms feature chandeliers and a collection of antiques and other special pieces acquired through auctions and during their travels. The home's interior features reclaimed brick, primarily from the Chicago and Boston areas, and beams created from primitive wood. The six solid limestone columns in the house are from the original Greene County Courthouse. After being removed from the courthouse, the columns later belonged to the Lester E. Cox Family and were later purchased by the Barbo Family. The fireplace in the family room can also be enjoyed while entertaining guests on the back porch, which overlooks their beautiful property. During the holidays, the family room is also home to a large Christmas Fontanini Village and nativity scene collection. The Barbos also display collections of antique whisk brooms, tea sets and Occupied Japan Figurines. The two-story library, with a spiral staircase, is the perfect place to curl up and read. The craft room, designed especially for Mrs. Barbo, who is a scrapbooker, quilter and mixed media crafter, will leave any craft lover breathless. The basement is complete with a media room and pool room and is the perfect place for entertaining teenagers.
